- At Lincoln Land, choose a (G) Global Diversity and a (U) US Diversity course from recommended list to meet IWU graduation requirements. US diversity: HIS 111, HIS 112, **POS 101**, HUM 110 (previously 102) and Global diversity: PHI 210, **POS 202**, **POS 220**.
- AP scores of 3, 4 and 5 will receive 1 unit of credit. Higher level IB scores of 4 or higher will receive 1 unit of credit
- Remedial math courses may be needed to prepare for the math requirement. However, remedial courses will not transfer to IWU. Adjust schedule and hour requirements accordingly to complete degree.
- The second language requirement for this major requires students to demonstrate proficiency at a third-semester level. Proficiency can be met by earning a 4 or 5 on the AP exam in a second language. Completion of LLCC Intermediate level 201 also meets the requirement. IWU offers second language coursework in Spanish, Japanese, and American Sign Language. French coursework is available through agreements with other campuses.
- Students should complete the Associate in Arts with a minimum of 64 semester hours, not including remedial or PE courses, at Lincoln Land to be on track to complete their bachelor's degree in a total of four years.
- Students are required, at minimum, to complete 16 units of coursework at IWU including half of all major requirements.
- IWU Graduation requirements: 32 total courses and 32 total units with 9 courses and 9 units of upper level courses. (1 IWU unit = 4 semester hours)
