# ILLINOIS WESLEYAN UNIVERSITY



**Illinois Wesleyan University**, founded in 1850, enrolls about 2,100 undergraduates in the College of Liberal Arts, with 17 academic departments, and in the Schools of Art, Music, Nursing and Theatre Arts. The University has been mentioned favorably in a number of annual college guides - The Fiske Guide to Colleges called IWU the "...the perfect place for multitalented students to thrive" and listed the school as one of only eleven "Best Buys" for private institutions; Barron's Profiles of American Colleges, the Princeton Review, and Peterson's Competitive Colleges also rank IWU highly, and Washington Post education editor Jay Matthews, author of Harvard Schmarvard, listed IWU as a top ten "hidden gem" after surveying hundreds of high school teachers and guidance counselors across the country, asking for colleges that excelled at student-centered teaching. Emphasizing a distinctive liberal arts curriculum as the central feature of every student's education, IWU also provides opportunities for professional and pre-professional preparation. The student-faculty ratio of 12-to-1 means that the University's students are active participants in their education, often working individually with faculty members on research. As a residential university, Illinois Wesleyan provides a vibrant campus environment in which rich co-curricular offerings complement the primary academic mission. About 30 percent of each graduating class goes on to graduate school, with recent alumni accepted into law schools, medical schools, and in other advanced degree programs.

**New Facilities.** The \$25 million Ames Library, a place where books, journals and other materials of intellect and culture are complemented by exciting computer and information technology, opened in 2002 and the recent \$6 million renovation of the Memorial Gym has resulted in the Hansen Student Center, a facility designed to meet the social, recreational, and educational needs of IWU students. IWU's attractive and well-maintained 73-acre campus saw approximately \$51 million in new construction in the 1990s, including the Shirk Center for Athletics and Recreation (1994), the Center for Natural Science Learning and Research

(1995), the Center for Liberal Arts (1997) as well as a residence hall, accommodating 118 students in suite-like apartments (1997).

The Shirk Center was funded in part by a \$5 million gift from the Russell and Betty Shirk Foundation of Bloomington. The Shirk family owns Beer Nuts, Inc., the Bloomington-based snack food company. The complex seats 2,680 in its performance arena, and contains four multi-use courts for tennis, volleyball, basketball, as well as a 200-meter track and other facilities. In 1999 the Jack Horenberger Baseball Field was opened, which paved the way in 2000 for new softball and soccer fields.

The science center has 15 technologically-equipped classrooms, lecture halls, and seminar rooms; 18 teaching labs; 27 research labs; and facilities for computers. The Center for Liberal Arts houses 60 faculty offices, classrooms, and facilities for social science, humanities, business and economics.

**Distinguished Speakers.** IWU has hosted a number of outstanding speakers, including former U.S. Defense Secretary William Cohen, authors Maya Angelou and Kurt Vonnegut, and film directors Ken Burns, Kevin Smith and Spike Lee.

**Accomplished Alums.** Illinois Wesleyan alumni of distinction include Edward B. Rust, Jr., '72, president and chief executive officer of Bloomington-based State Farm Insurance; Dawn Upshaw '82, a two-time Grammy-award winning singer with the New York Metropolitan Opera; Frankie Faison '71, who has appeared in the films "Silence of the Lambs", "The Thomas Crown Affair" and "Coming to America"; Akito Mizuno '74, senior managing director of Mizuno, the world's largest sporting goods company; Steve Vogel '68, author of the best-selling true crime book "Reasonable Doubt"; and Richard Jenkins '69, who portrayed Nathaniel in a recurring role in the award-winning HBO series "Six Feet Under."



## RICHARD F. WILSON, PRESIDENT

Richard F. Wilson became the 18th president at Illinois Wesleyan in July 2004.

Since 1978 Wilson has served in a number of roles at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, most recently (since 1996) as Vice President of the U. of Illinois Foundation. He was responsible for all private fundraising on the Urbana campus,

including leading campus efforts to achieve its \$1 billion goal as part of the university's comprehensive campaign.

From 1986 to 1994, Wilson was Associate Chancellor, leading efforts to incorporate computing technologies into instruction and providing oversight of intercollegiate athletics. In 1994, he became Associate Chancellor for Development and Deputy Director of the University of Illinois Foundation. Since 1981 Wilson held an adjunct teaching position in the College of Education, most recently as Adjunct Professor of Higher Education.

Wilson earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics from Alderson-Broadus College (W.Va.), where he earned honors in both academics and athletics.

Wilson pursued advanced degrees at the University of Michigan, earning both the master's and doctoral degrees in higher education.

Wilson and his wife, Pat, have two children — Adam, who lives in San Francisco, and Rachel, who lives in Springfield, Ill.

# HEAD COACH MIA SMITH



The all-time victories leader for women's basketball at Illinois Wesleyan University, head coach Mia Smith will be starting her 10th season at the school in the 2007-08 campaign. In her first nine seasons, Smith has coached the Titans to a record of 143-91 (.611 winning percentage) and a 79-47 College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin record (.627).

In her nine seasons she has coached 17 all-conference selections, including two league "Most Outstanding Players" and she became the school's all-time win leader with a win on Jan. 20, 2007 at North Park, passing Mandy Neal (135-120 from 1989-98).

In 2006-07, IWU sported a 22-6 record and played in the NCAA Division III tournament. The team set a school record for victories, topping the old mark of 20, and also set school records for 3-pointers in a game (19 at Emory) and season (247, eclipsing the record of 209 set in 2003). IWU was ranked nationally throughout the season after opening with a 10-game winning streak, including a victory over eventual national champion DePauw. IWU was ranked as high as No. 10 on Feb. 6.

Smith's 2005-06 team was 19-8 overall (10-4 CCIW) and advanced to the championship game of the CCIW postseason tournament and in 2005, IWU was beaten in the CCIW final by eventual national Division III champion Milikin.

In 2002-03, the Titans were 20-9 and 11-3 in the CCIW, winning both the regular season and tournament championships (the first in women's basketball at IWU). The Titans also won their first-ever NCAA Division III tournament game after being 0-2 in two previous appearances. Smith was named the 2003 Illinois Basketball Coaches Association Division III co-"Coach of the Year."

Prior to coming to IWU in 1998, Smith coached (since 1994) volleyball and softball at Division III Monmouth College (Illinois), where her volleyball teams were 55-69 in four seasons and her softball teams were 61-54.

Smith coached basketball and two other sports at Carrollton High School in west central Illinois from 1986 to 1994. Her basketball mark was 156-55 with three consecutive regional and sectional titles and she was twice named IBCA regional "Coach of the Year." Her 1992 team finished 28-3 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the Class A state tournament, and her 1993 and 1994 teams both lost in the super-sectional round. In volleyball, Smith's Carrollton teams were 127-69 with five straight regional titles and her softball teams were 97-54 with three regional championships and two league championships.

A native of Farina, Ill., and graduate of LaGrove High School, Smith earned her bachelor's and master's degrees in physical education from Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville, where she was a four-year letterwinner in basketball and softball. She was

the basketball team captain for three seasons and earned "Defensive Player of the Year" honors four times. She was named to the 1983 Dial Classic all-tournament team. A Dean's List student, she was an SIUE "Scholar-Athlete" and the school's "Sportsmanship Award" winner in 1986.

Smith also teaches classes in the IWU physical education department.

## ASSISTANT COACHES



**Tom Garriott** (left) is in his second year as a Titan assistant. A graduate of Illinois State University, he has coached at Bloomington (Ill.) Central Catholic, Normal U High (from 1999-2006 with teams that made two state final appearances) and at Thomas Metcalf Junior High School. Garriott is employed full-time as a software analyst at Country Financial and he and his wife, Janice, have four children [Alicia, Melissa, Sara, and Aaron, who plays at Central Catholic and has signed a letter of intent at SIU-Edwardsville]. **Matt Petersen** (right) is in his first season as an IWU assistant. He spent one year as assistant boys coach at Spring Valley (Ill.) Hall High School after three years as a girls assistant coach at Normal U High. A native of Spring Valley, he played in two Class A state championship games and played basketball at Iowa Wesleyan before graduating from Illinois State. In coaching the Illinois Valley Starz AAU girls team for five years (2002-07) he coached more than 30 players now competing in college basketball programs. Serving as a student assistant coach this season is **Tasha Gaston-Bell**, a two-year IWU letterwinner. Last season she played in all 28 games and started seven, averaging 5.2 points per game and scoring 21 points at North Central. As a sophomore she played in 18 games, averaging 1.3 points, and as a freshman she played in seven first semester games and averaged 5.9 points per game. A product of Bloomington (Ill.) High School, she earned four basketball letters in high school, was the Purple Raiders' "MVP" as a junior and senior and was named to The Pantagraph all-area team as a senior.

## ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



Dennie Bridges' association with Illinois Wesleyan began when he enrolled as a student in 1957. Bridges retired in March 2001 after 36 seasons as basketball coach with a career record of 667-319, second most all-time among NCAA Division III coaches. His 1997 team was 29-2 and won the Division III championship, while his 1996 (28-3) and 2001 (24-7) teams each placed third nationally. His teams won 17 conference championships and qualified for the Division III playoffs 14 times in 18 seasons. Since Bridges became athletic director (1981), the Shirk Center, Fort Natatorium and Jack Horenberger Baseball Field have been built, as well as new facilities for soccer and softball. Bridges, who graduated in 1961 and began his IWU coaching career in 1964, earned letters in basketball, baseball and football and was all-conference in basketball and football as an IWU player. Bridges and his wife, Rita, have three grown children, all IWU graduates and former Titan athletes. Eldest son Steve was a four-year football letterman and was an Academic All-American.

**SARAH BULL, senior, Lewistown (HS)**

**CRYSTAL DYE, senior, Springfield (Southeast HS)**

AT ILLINOIS WESLEYAN: Has earned three letters and serves as co-captain for 2007-08 team...Enters season No. 24 all-time at IWU with 307 career rebounds...2006-07: Starter in all 28 games...Led team in scoring once and in rebounds 11 times, including four of last seven games...Had season highs of 21 points

(Elmhurst), 12 rebounds (Augustana), and 4 assists (Elmhurst)...Chosen as "Defensive Player of the Year" for second time in career...2005-06: Played in only nine games, starting six, and averaged 6.0 points and 4.6 rebounds...Also averaged more than two assists and steals per game...2004-05: Named team's "Defensive Player of the Year"...Played in all 27 games and started 14...Had highs of 18 points and 13 rebounds (in OT loss at Millikin) and five assists (Baruch)... Scored in double figures six times...2003-04: Missed the entire season after undergoing knee surgery in December 2003. PERSONAL: Crystal Nichelle

Dye...Born 10-3-84...Four year letterwinner and Central State Eight "Player of the Year" and all-state as a senior when she averaged 11.4 points, 5.2 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game...Special mention on Chicago Tribune all-state team and honorable mention Champaign News-Gazette team...High school coach: Mario Borders...Honorable mention all-state in volleyball and state qualifier in track events... Anthropology major with a Spanish minor...Also a letterwinner in volleyball at IWU...Daughter of Betsy Dye and Robert Dye.



**MALLORY HEYDORN, junior,  
LaGrange (Lyons Township HS)**

AT ILLINOIS WESLEYAN – Has earned two letters and will serve as co-captain of 2007-08 team... After two seasons, Heydorn is No. 27 in career scoring at IWU with 715 points and No. 6 with 136 3-pointers, closing in on the 3-point career mark of 171 (Traci Butler, 1992-96)...2006-07: First team all-CCIW selection and a second team all-Central

region choice...Suffered broken thumb on her right (shooting) hand on Feb. 15 and didn't play in two final regular season games or CCIW tournament games...Led team in scoring 10 times and in rebounding four games...Averaged a team-high 17.1 points and made a school record 85 3-pointers... Her 410 points is tied for sixth most in an IWU season...Set a school and CCIW record with 11 3-point field goals at Augustana (Feb. 14)...Had season highs of 37 points (Augustana), nine rebounds (Oglethorpe), and eight assists (Augustana)... The 37 points is the third most in an IWU single game, behind Lila Naffziger (45 vs. Eureka, 1979-80) and Sara Seebruch (39 vs. North Central on Jan. 16, 1999)...2005-06: Second team all-CCIW player as freshman as she finished eighth in scoring and fifth in assists and 3-point field goal percentage in the league...Had highs of 23 points (Elmhurst), nine rebounds (Carthage) and eight assists (Augustana)...Was team's leading scorer in five games...Her 51 3-pointers is fourth most in a season and No. 14 in an IWU career after only one year...PERSONAL: Born 11-5-86...High school coach: Dawn Schabacker...Earned four letters in basketball and two in badminton for the Lions...Illinois Basketball Coaches Association all-state player...Chosen all-area and all-conference and was her team's MVP as well as two-year team captain...Undecided on college major at IWU...National Honor Society...High school teammate of Colleen Caplice and Becky Kiverts...She is the daughter of Allan Heydorn and Ursula Szwast.



**KERRI GRAVLIN, senior,  
Metamora (HS)**

## HARNISCH, CANTRELL CCIW "PLAYERS OF YEAR" HONORS



In 2006, Heidi Harnisch (left) became the second Illinois Wesleyan player to be chosen as the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin "Player of the Year" since league play began for women in 1987. Harnisch led the league in 3-pointers per game and 3-point percentage. She connected on 77 3-pointers and averaged 14.5 points in the entire season and finished her career as IWU's 20th all-time scorer with 845 points.

In 2003, Katie Cantrell was the first Titan to earn the award as she set IWU season records with 490 points and 82 3-pointers. A first team all-CCIW and D3hoops.com all-Central region selection, Cantrell led IWU to its first-ever league championship with a team-high 16.9 points per game average.
